Understanding India's 2014 general election and rise of PM Narendra Modi

Running in nine phases from 7 April to 12 May 2014 with about 814 million eligible voters, the 2014 general election in India was the longest in the country's history, and resulted in the elevation of Indian right-wing party BJP as the strongest party at the national parliament, and Mr. Narendra Modi as the Prime Minister. This talk aims to discuss why these elections were different, and what Mr. Modi's ascent to the country's top position mean in India's political context.
