<u>Wolfgang Röhr</u> is Senior Research Fellow at the German Studies Center of Tongji University and former Consul General for Germany in Shanghai. He studied law in Hamburg, Tübingen and Geneva, and holds a PhD in Law from Hamburg University. From 1978 to 2014, he served in the German Foreign Service, for six years in the Political Department of the Embassy in Beijing and eight years as Consul General in Shanghai. He also directed the East Asia Desk at the Foreign Office and was Ambassador and Head of the Task Force China-Germany. He also served at Geneva, New York, Tel Aviv, Hong Kong, and Lisbon, and was a member of the German Delegations at the United Nations, the Committee on Disarmament, NATO, the European Union and the Western European Union.
