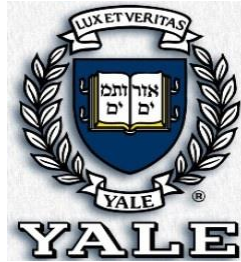

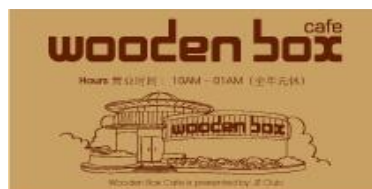

[Deborah Davis](#) is Professor of Sociology at Yale University, where she has served as Director of Academic Programs at the Yale Center for the Study of Globalization, Chair of the Department of Sociology, and Chair of the Council of East Asian Studies, and currently as Vice President of the Board of Trustees of the Yale-China Association. She is also an Associate Editor of *The Journal of Asian Studies* and on the editorial board of *The China Quarterly* and *The China Review*, and won the Lex Hixon Prize for Teaching Excellence in the Social Sciences. She is author or editor of ten books, including [The Consumer Revolution in Urban China](#) (2000), [SARS: Reception and Interpretation in three Chinese Cities](#) (2007), [Creating Wealth and Poverty in China](#) (2009), and most recently [Wives, Husbands and Lovers: Marriage and Sexuality in Hong Kong, Taiwan, and Urban China](#) (2014).
