

# SSSC on Natural Resources & Knowledgebased Sustainable Development

China's Marine Safety Administration released the "Arctic navigation guide (Northwest Passage) 2015" earlier this month. Ministry Spokesman LIU Pengfei highlighted China's ambition to open up the far North changing maritime transportation "having a direct impact on international trade, the world economy, capital flows and natural resource exploration" (MSA, 2016)

While melting ice-caps in the Arctic are posing an environmental challenge, this development opens up the region for increased economic activity. To discuss China's Arctic ambitions the 13th Shanghai Social Science Colloquium will welcome:

### • Dr. Rasmus G. BERTELSEN, Professor &

Barents Chair in Politics at the University of Tromsø - The Arctic University of Norway



Using International Relations theory to analyse China's role in the region, Dr. Bertelsen will provide his interpretation of 'China and the Arctic: Natural Resources and Knowledge-Based Sustainable Development'. Having previously emphasised parallels between the north pole, the south pole, and the so-called 'third pole' - the ice-covered Himalayas - Dr. Bertelsen's research may offer new insights on how to use knowledge-based sustainable development to better manage natural rescue governance in the Arctic region.
