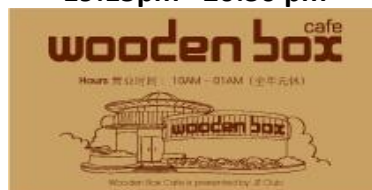

[Finding India in China](#), by author Anurag Viswanath, whisks the reader on a whirlwind journey through China's margins. In part an intellectual travelogue, the voyage equally mixes in humorous anecdotes, oddball encounters, and thoughtful reflections on the vastness that is China. With her distinctive Indian perspective, Anurag Viswanath slices through preconceptions and shibboleths in her interactions with a motley set of characters -- from Muslim housewives in Xinjiang to Mongols dressing up for tourism, and from academics to party officials to migrant workers.

[Anurag Viswanath](#) is Adjunct Fellow at the Institute of China Studies in Delhi and an independent writer based in Singapore. She has published over 85 articles in publications such as the Bangkok Post, Prachatai & Nation, Far Eastern Economic Review, and the Journal of Contemporary Asia. She has written for the Indian publications, Economic and Political Weekly, Global Affairs, and Indian Management, was a regular writer at Business Standard from 2007-2011, and is currently a leading columnist with Financial Express. While she has written about Thailand, India, and Singapore, her main focus is on contemporary China. Anurag graduated with a MA from Hindu College after a BA from Miranda House - ranking among the top five in the University of Delhi. She obtained her Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Delhi, has been a visiting scholar at UCLA, and taught for two years at Kamala Nehru College, University of Delhi before returning to writing full-time.
