

Since the PyeongChang Winter Olympic Games in early 2018, hopes have risen for a peaceful solution to the crisis on the Korean peninsula. Summits between the North Korean leader, Kim Jong Un and the U.S., South Korean, and Chinese Presidents have taken place. Yet these ups have been followed by various downs. How can the "peaceful momentum" be preserved? What role could the EU play in this?

Tereza Novotná is a Fudan Fellow at Fudan University's Centre for European Studies and was previously a Korea Foundation Visiting Professor at Seoul National University. She is also an academic collaborator with the Institute for European Studies, Université Libre de Bruxelles and a Senior Associate Research Fellow at the Brussels office of the EUROPEUM, a Prague-based think tank. Her current research examines what role the EU could play in helping solve the North Korean crisis. Although Tereza's work focuses primarily on EU foreign policy, her broader interests include EU enlargement, democratization and integration processes (in Europe and Korea), transatlantic relations and trade negotiations, and the politics of Central and Eastern Europe as well as Germany. Tereza received a Ph.D. in Politics and European Studies from Boston University and her bachelors and masters degrees from Charles University Prague. She is the author of How Germany Unified and the EU Enlarged: Negotiating the Accession through Transplantation and Adaptation (2015) and co-editor of The Politics of Transatlantic Trade Negotiations: TTIP in a Globalized World (2015).
