Robbie Shields is College Counselor, Alumni Affairs Manager, and Teacher at Shanghai Qibao-Dwight High School. Previously, he worked for six years as Employer Engagement Manager and Career Consultant at the Hopkins-Nanjing Center (HNC), where he launched and managed career initiatives, creating and developing career treks, hosting career-focused mini-courses, teaching a professional development course and creating a scholarship fund to support students in internships. He holds a BA in the History from the University of Tennessee and a JD from the University of Florida.

Bonnie Liu is the Overseas Market Director at Xiaozao, which is an online education platform focused on helping young professionals with career development. Bonnie was previously Director of Career Services Office at Duke Kunshan University, where she started as a "one-man team" and built up a full career services function from scratch, providing both service and support to both the four-year undergraduate program and five specialized master programs. Before to joining Duke, Bonnie was Assistant Director of Career Management at the Simon Business School, University of Rochester.
