

He is Executive Editor of *China Quarterly of International Strategic Studies*, English editor of *Cross-Taiwan Strait Studies*, and an editorial board member of *Journal of Political Marketing*. He was a visiting fellow at the *Henry L. Stimson Center* in 2011 and at *Center for Strategic and International Studies (CSIS)* in 2016. He is also the translator of two books and author of dozens of journal articles and book chapters. His recent publications include: "Beyond the Strategic Deterrence Narrative: Deploying THAAD May Trigger Immediate Security Crises in Asia," "China's International Strategy and Its Implications for Southeast Asia," and "China's Pursuit of a New Asia-Pacific Security Architecture: Underlying Rationale, Ongoing Actions, and Future Prospects." Zhang holds a PhD in International Relations from Fudan University and is a 2003 graduate of the <u>Hopkins-Nanjing Center</u>.
