

Europe Meets the China Challenge: Explaining Recent EU Moves on China

The European Union has in recent months has toughened its stance on China. These include moves designating China a "security competitor" and decisions on investment reciprocity and market access, all in the context of members states' decisions on Huawei, Chinese investment in European technology, and the Belt and Road Initiative (such as Italy's joining the BRI). Are these moves as sudden as they seem? Has the EU-China relationship shifted decisively? Tonight's talk will attempt to answer these questions.

Miguel Otero-Iglesias is Senior Analyst at the Elcano Royal Institute and Research Associate at the EU-Asia Institute at ESSCA School of Management. Dr. Otero-Iglesias is also co-founder and member of the European Tank Network on China (ETNC). Previously he was Assistant Professor in International Political Economy at ESSCA in Paris, Adjunct Lecturer at the University of Oxford, Postdoctoral Research Fellow at LSE and Associate Lecturer at Oxford Brookes University, where earned his PhD in International Political Economy. He has also been a Visiting Research Fellow at the Institute of International Relations in Rio de Janeiro as well as the Institute of World Economics and Politics of the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences in Beijing.
