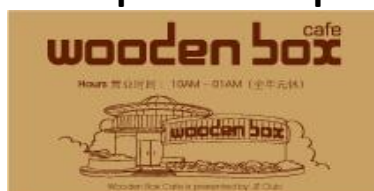

This talk will focus on China's response to climate change. Since 2001, China's neo-mercantilist ambition has been shaping a new climate policy, which will have immense impact on China's domestic and global economic landscape. Authoritarianism can also be green, but in a different way, and China is the first non-country in the non-Western world making good business out of climate change. The global environment favors China's efforts, yet China will still remain full of contradictions in combating climate change.

[Zhang Junhua](#) is Senior Associate at the [European Institute for Asian Studies](#) in Brussels and was for 10 years Professor of Political Science at Jiaotong University. Apart from his long affiliations with the Free University Berlin and Wissenschaftszentrum Berlin, he has also been visiting professor at several universities around the world, including the University of Victoria in British Columbia, the University of Moscow, and the Institut Européen des Hautes Etudes Internationales. His research includes Chinese politics, international security, international political economy, and social memory, and his most recent book is [Participatory Budgeting in Asia and Europe](#) (2012). Zhang holds a Ph.D. in Philosophy from the J.W.Goethe-University in Germany.
