This talk will discuss three major issues: (1) Is the nature of Sino-Russian relations a "marriage of convenience, "brothers in arms," or "anti-American alliance?" (2) How deep will relations go? (3) How can the two countries reconcile and resolve key differences in worldviews and approaches to world affairs?

Zhang Xin is an Associate Professor at the School of Advanced International and Area Studies, and Deputy Director of Center for Russian Studies, East China Normal University in Shanghai. He received his PhD in Political Science from UCLA and has taught at Reed College, Fudan University, and Higher School of Economics. His major research fields are comparative political economy, critical geopolitics, and Russian/Eurasian politics. His research has appeared in multiple languages in the Review of International Political Economy, Geopolitics, Osteuropa, China Journal, Russia in Global Affairs, etc. An active media commentator and consultant on global affairs, he has also written commissioned policy reports for Ministry of Foreign Affairs of China, China Development Bank, and Valdai Club.
