This talk will touch upon the concept of Science Diplomacy and the speaker's own personal journey across Japan, the U.S. and China in this regard. Science diplomacy is a fast-growing field of education, research, innovation, and practice dedicated to better understanding and reinforcing the connections between science, technology, and international affairs to tackle national and global challenges. Science diplomacy is part of the toolbox of traditional diplomacy defined by politics, trade, and economics. The idea is that science can serve as an efficient tool for dialogue, often less conflicting and designed for collaboration, offering platforms for new forms of interaction and interdisciplinarity. Various examples from Swissnex will cover some surprising aspects of vocational training and higher education, startup market entry in China, some research and interdisciplinary initiatives and, of course, the S&T Diplomatic Circles.

Dr. Felix Moesner is Science Consul and CEO of Swissnex China, the Science Consulate of Switzerland in China, as well as Vice President of the Swiss Chamber of Commerce in Shanghai. With a Ph.D. in Robotics, MBA and MSc from ETH Zurich, MIT and the University of Tokyo, Dr. Felix Moesner acquired professional experiences in governmental, private and academic sectors at Swissnex in China, Swissnex in Boston, the Embassy of Switzerland in Tokyo, Credit Suisse Life Insurance Japan, Synpulse, the Kanagawa Academy of Science & Technology, Toshiba Corporation Japan, and Egon Zehnder International Zurich. He supports the mobility of talent, research collaboration and exchange of expertise between Switzerland and Greater China. Besides his broad professional duties, he also founded and currently chairs the Science & Technology Diplomatic Circle Shanghai.
