For the Europeans, with Biden in office, "America is back." During Trump's presidency economic relations between Europe and China have nevertheless thrived: In 2020, China overtook the US as the EU's largest trading partner. Politically, the choice for Europe is clear, but economically less so. While frictions between the US and China are increasing, Europe is searching for its place in the world.

Wolfgang Röhr is Senior Research Fellow at the German Studies Center of Tongji University and a former Consul General of Germany in Shanghai. From 1978 to 2014, he served in the German Foreign Service, for six years in the Political Department of the Embassy in Beijing and eight years as Consul General in Shanghai. He directed the East Asia Desk at the Foreign Office and was Ambassador and Head of the Task Force China-Germany. He also served in Geneva, New York, Tel Aviv, Hong Kong, and Lisbon, and has been a member of the German delegations at the U.N., the Committee on Disarmament, NATO, the EU, and the Western European Union. He holds a PhD in Law from Hamburg University.
