

As Southeast Asia's most populous country, Indonesia is important to China and vice versa in their bilateral relationship. Starting in December, Indonesia also holds the chairmanship of the G20, and in 2023, Indonesia will also hold chairmanship of ASEAN. Join Indonesia's Consul for Public Diplomacy in Shanghai as he shares his long diplomatic experience, from his first posting in Los Angeles (2004-2007) after 9/11 to London (2011-2014) and now Shanghai, where covid-19 has refocused Indonesia's diplomatic efforts.
