The first "modern" western maps of China appeared in the 16th century. Through the lens of map making, one can see the changing understanding and appreciation of China in the West. Using as a lens the development of China as depicted in Western maps over the centuries, the talk also looks at how maps shape our view of reality, how maps are shaped by our needs and requirements, how maps rely on existing knowledge and therefore through their development depict the history of a place, and lastly why maps cannot be perfect and what that means for our understanding of the world.

Christian Kober holds a doctorate in Chemistry from the University of Munich. He has lived and studied in Germany, the US, Japan and, since 1998, China. He has worked in a variety of leadership positions in several industries like Wacker Chemicals, Evonik, BASF and Geberit. Currently he is Senior Vice President for Asia at the Hoffmann Group, a German supplier of industrial tools. He is a member of the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science, the Association of German Sciences (Stifterverband), the Toenissteiner Kreis, Fulbright Alumni and the Rotary Club of Shanghai.
