[George Hu](#) is Chief of Mental Health at Shanghai United Family Hospital and Clinics. He earned his BA in Psychology from the University of California at Berkeley, and his MA and PhD Clinical Psychology from the California School of Professional Psychology at Alliant International University. Doctor Hu completed training rotations at the Autism Intervention Clinic at Oakland Children's Hospital, the San Francisco Veteran's Affairs Hospital, and the Portia Bell Hume Center in California, as well as the Shaanxi Provincial People's Hospital in Xi'an. Previously, Doctor Hu was the Director of Psychology and Mental Health at Jiahui Health, the Clinical Director at Octave Living, and Clinical Psychologist and the Assistant Director of the Center for Cognitive Behavioral Therapy at Beijing United Family Hospital. He is a clinical faculty member at Palo Alto University and provides clinical consultation in many parts of the world, including Southeast Asia and Central Asia.
