This discussion points out distinctions between the various styles of international tertiary and post-graduate education (North American; Commonwealth; European; Mainland), how to prepare for each and specific steps that will improve an applicant's odds for gaining entry into programs well-suited to the desires and goals of the applicant.

Titus Levi is an Associate Professor at the Institute of Cultural and Creative Industry, run by USC and Jiaotong University. He holds a PhD in Economics from the University of California Irvine with a focus on the radio industry, media, and policy.
