Singapore, a tiny island city-state in Southeast Asia, is known for being a regional hub for transport, trading, and finance. Underpinning this status is our foreign policy to expand our international space in the world, which includes pursuing good relations with countries including China on the basis of mutual interests. This talk will focus on Singapore's foreign policy, and the diplomatic and economic relations between the two countries over the past 30 years.

Shuting Yow is a diplomat at the Singapore Consulate-General in Shanghai. Back in Singapore, she had covered China and Southeast Asia, and had served at diplomatic missions in Jakarta and Bangkok. She holds a masters' degree from Johns Hopkins University's Nitze School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS) and a bachelors' degree from Peking University.
