ESG is now one of the hottest topics in investment and financial market regulation. But with tweets by Elon Musk claiming that "ESG is a scam" and a recent cover The Economist claiming "ESG – the three letters which will not save the world," there is clearly a debate. This deals with the discourse and development of non-financial ESG (Environment, Social, and Governance) reporting, indicators, and investment in China, Europe and the U.S. The talk will give an introduction to the concept of ESG as well as the regulatory developments in China, Europe and the US related to the field, before discussing which ESG issues if any – are a scam.
