Based on nine months of research with migrant construction workers in Shanghai, this talk focuses on the experiences of men working in Shanghai's infrastructure construction industry. This talk will reveal both how the city's immense construction industry functions on the ground level, as well as the less-visible background of how men working in the construction industry position themselves in the face of rapidly changing understandings of what it means to be a man in urban China.

Leif Johnson is an Assistant Professor in the Department of China Studies at Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University (XJTLU). Trained as a Geographer, his research focuses on migration and forms of legal and social bordering, with an emphasis on the roles played by gender in migration processes. His current research and writing focuses on the experiences of men who migrate into the construction industry in the Yangtze river delta, particularly in infrastructure construction.
