Despite geopolitical uncertainty and rising domestic challenges, China's Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) has shown resilience and versatility. By placing more importance on the quality of the projects and increasing regionalization and securitization of the initiative, the talk will discuss how the BRI is adapting to new contexts in Africa.

Maria Adele Carrai is an Assistant Professor of Global China Studies at NYU Shanghai. Her research explores the history of international law in East Asia and investigates how China's rise as a global power shapes norms and redefines the international distribution of power. She coleads the Research Initiative "Mapping Global China" and is the author of <u>Sovereignty in China: A Geneaology of a Concept since 1840</u> (2019) and co-editor of <u>The China Questions 2: Critical Insights into US-China</u> <u>Relations</u> (2022) Before joining NYU Shanghai, she was a recipient of a three-year Marie-Curie fellowship at KU Leuven. She was also a Fellow at the Italian Academy of Columbia University, Princeton-Harvard China and the World Program, Max Weber Program of the European University Institute of Florence, and New York University Law School.
