## **CHINA CROSSROADS**

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African Food Security and the Role of Asian Agricultural Investments: Firsthand Observations from Africa

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The world food system is witnessing a triple crisis: (1) the Ukraine War, (2) climate change, and (3) distortion in the international trade system. Africa's food security has taken a big hit. At the same time, Africa is witnessing a new wave of investment into its agricultural sector, especially from Asian countries, as the triple crisis motivates a transformation of the global food system. This talk will share first-hand observations of these trends and will challenge common biases regarding Africa and agriculture, especially among Asian investors.

Cheng Cheng is Asian Partnerships Lead at AGRA in Nairobi, Kenya. He previously served as Chief Economist at Made in Africa Initiative and Senior Advisor for the UNDP Asia-Pacific in Thailand. He has also worked as a Research Fellow at the Chongyang Institute for Financial Studie at Renmin University. He has published dozens of articles in Chinese and international journals and has co-authored two books both on development economics and finance in Africa. He is also author of Official Development Finance with Chinese Characteristics: A New Model for China Africa Cooperation (2018) and a frequent commentator for several television networks. He holds a PhD in Political Science from Nanjing University and was a Visiting Scholar the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS).
