Over the last decade environmental concerns have become a key feature of China's modernisation encapsulated in the goal of becoming an "Ecological Civilization." Domestically, renewable energies are becoming a key driver for economic growth and massive reforestation projects are giving the country a greener image. At the same time, the environment is also becoming an increasingly important topic in Chinese diplomacy where its "Ecological Civilization" and "Nature-based Solutions" are exposed to more critical debates.

Niklas Weins is Assistant Professor of International Studies at Xi'an Jiaotong-Liverpool University (XJTLU). He holds a PhD in Environment and Society from the Center for Environmental Studies and Research (NEPAM) at the State University of Campinas in Brazil, where he took a multi-level approach to Chinas environmental governance. He focused on ecological compensation mechanisms and the concept of Ecological Civilization, on which he also worked while he was a Visiting Researcher at the Environmental Policy Group at Wageningen University. He is interested in the political economy of environmental issues (biodiversity, conservation, climate change) and Chinas relations with the Global South in bilateral and multilateral institutions.
