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This talk will explore the Mapping Global China Project, which goes beyond merely tracking Chinese investments worldwide. It delves into multifaceted impacts of China's global interactions, encompassing economic, environmental, social, and political dimensions. Employing a diverse array of data sources, including geospatial analysis and case studies, the project sheds light on how China's overseas activities influence global development patterns, environmental sustainability, and international policy dynamics. This comprehensive approach provides insights into the strategic implications of China's Belt and Road Initiative and other foreign engagements, offering a nuanced perspective on China's role on the world stage.

[Maria Adele Carrai](#) is Assistant Professor of Global China Studies at NYU Shanghai. Her research explores the history of international law in East Asia and investigates how China's rise as a global power shapes norms and redefines the international distribution of power. She co-leads the Research Initiative "Mapping Global China" and is the author of [Sovereignty in China: A Genealogy of a Concept since 1840](#) (2019) and co-editor of [The China Questions 2: Critical Insights into US-China Relations](#) (2022) Before joining NYU Shanghai, she was a recipient of a three-year Marie-Curie fellowship at KU Leuven. She was also a Fellow at the Italian Academy of Columbia University, Princeton-Harvard China and the World Program, Max Weber Program of the European University Institute of Florence, and New York University Law School.
