According to Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney, we have entered into a period of great power rivalry, in which the most powerful pursue their interests using economic integration as a weapon of coercion. This presentation will explore the rivalry between the US and China across security, supply chains and trade. It will then discuss the principled and pragmatic path Prime Minister Carney has laid out.

Mark Kruger is based in Shanghai and holds Senior Fellow appointments at the Yicai Research Institute, the Centre for International Governance Innovation and University of Alberta's China Institute. Between 2020 and 2023, Mark was the Opinion Editor at Yicai Global. Previously, he had a 30-year career with the Bank of Canada in the course of which he served as a Senior Advisor to the Canadian Executive Director at the IMF and the head of the Economic and Financial Section of the Canadian Embassy in Beijing.
